

With summer at our doorstep, it's time once more for sunny outdoor adventures. But be-

fore you jump in the pool or go on a bike ride, stay protected against the sun.

Here are a few tips to make sure you're getting the best use out of your sunscreen:

- Go for a water-resistant sunscreen if you're going to be in the water or sweating a lot. In FDA
 terms, "water-resistant" means the SPF will work up to 40 minutes after getting in the water —
 so don't forget to reapply!
- Speaking of which, you should reapply every two hours no matter what.
- Lather yourself up 15-30 minutes before you expose yourself to the sun.
- Don't let your sunscreen expire that's a real thing.
- Wear sunscreen even if it's not sunny. About 80% of the sun's UV rays still get through on an overcast day.
- Wear chapstick or lip balm that protects against the sun too.

First Grade

Dear families! What a year! Can you believe the year is just about over? We are so appreciative to have been able to work with you and your child. We know this year has been very different but everyone persevered and learned new skills through it all. We couldn't be more proud of the students! Over the next couple of months we will focus on putting everything we have learned together to strengthen our reading, writing, and math skills to get ready for the next school year. The students will participate in an animal research project to culminate the year. They will continue to learn how to add and subtract double-digits. We thank you for your support this year. We know it hasn't been easy. Over the summer we encourage your child to read daily, write often, and to practice solving math equations to keep their skills sharp

Second Grade

Newton families it's hard to believe that this school year is quickly coming to an end. We would like to thank each of you for your support this year. In second grade, we have been working hard on completing the standards in our curriculum, and preparing students for third grade. In math, we are focusing on length, measurement and data. Students are learning to collect data, graph it, and analyze that data. Please remind students that it is imperative that they keep up on Zearn digital assignments by completing a minimum of 4 per week. In writing, we have focused on using our Thinking Maps to take us through the writing process. Students have learned to determine what Thinking maps they need draw them out, and utilize them with their writing. Please encourage students to continue doing their Lexia during summer. Students will have access to both. Lexia and Zearn over the summer. Thank you for a great school year!

Third Grade

It is hard to believe that the year is coming to an end. Please continue to have your child read nightly, complete the required minutes/units on Lexia, complete the assigned lessons on Zearn, and practice multiplication facts. Your child will continue to have access to Lexia and Zearn during the summer. It would greatly benefit your child to continue to work daily on these programs. The skills that they will acquire from these programs will help them be ready for fourth grade. We are working with invisible forces in science and having a real blast. Thank you for your continued support. This year has been one that we will all remember.

<u>Fourth Grade</u>

Fourth grade students are working hard to review skills and using testing strategies. In Language Arts, students are exploring Greek Mythology and we are doing a novel study on the Lightning Thief. Students are also revisiting all language concepts. In Math, students are completing their fraction unit. We will start converting fractions to decimals and solve equations within a word problem to finish out the year. Students are also earning AR points, Lexia minutes, completing Zearn lessons, completing multiplication facts on Xtra Math (to earn a free slurpee or Purple Penguin), and Khan minutes.

Fifth Grade

Welcome back to school to the many students who came back to the building! It's such a joy to be together for the last few weeks of school. We thank them for being safe and following the guidelines. Our fifth graders are doing an awesome job on their testing by working hard, giving their best effort, and pushing through difficult sections! We are so proud of them!
